



Trustee's Message

This set of abbreviated accounts for the financial year has been extracted from the full set of accounts for Little Hearts Matter, which has been subject to an independent examination and is available from the LHM office or website and Companies House

As of 31 December 2023, Little Hearts Matter (LHM) had 5,485 members. Total reserves stood at £398,164, with £145,181 in the general fund. The charity aims to maintain reserves covering three to six months of expenditure, currently holding approximately four months.

Income for 2023 was £446,659, consistent with the previous year, demonstrating resilience amidst economic challenges. Expenditure increased by 22% to £504,457, driven by leadership role changes, expanded fundraising efforts, activity weekends for members, and relocation costs.

The growth in Charity membership in recent years has led to increased demand for the various services offered. One key focus area is the increasing age of the children with single ventricle conditions and this has led to the next stage of the Charity's strategy – "Creating a Better Future". The Charity will continue to provide and expand on the services to families of the younger affected children as well as to bereaved families, but will also look to build these services and develop new support into a full roadmap as young people enter adulthood.
