Fill boxes with mystery

Players pay to guess and

prize!

Create a scavenger hunt
around your garden,
local park, or hall with
spooky clues and hidden
prizes.

Frightening Face
Painting
Offer face painting at
your event or party with
spooky designs such
as witches, skeletons,
pumpkins, or sparkly
bats!

Spooky Bake Sale
Bake and sell Halloween
treats like monster
cupcakes and ghost
biscuits.
